

Interdisciplinary Graduate Certificate in Real Estate (IGCRE) 2018-2019 Program Statement

OVERVIEW

The [Interdisciplinary Graduate Certificate in Real Estate \(IGCRE\)](#) recognizes interdisciplinary training in real estate, including real estate investment, real estate law, and the role of real estate development in the built environment. The IGCRE offers graduate students in the College of Environmental Design (ARCH, DCRP, LAEP), the Haas School of Business (Haas), and Berkeley Law the opportunity to supplement their major areas of study with courses that specifically focus on real estate.

As part of the IGCRE, students may (1) undertake specialized, multi-disciplinary courses in city planning and design, (2) learn about the process of development and gaining entitlements, (3) gain skills in financial and asset market analysis, (4) learn the legal foundations of construction and real estate transactions, and/or (5) explore housing and land use policy.

The IGCRE will give students explicit recognition of a specialization in real estate, which in complement to their graduate program, will position them to compete for jobs in law firms, public and private corporations with real estate investments, planning positions, design practices, local government, real estate development, and companies involved in real estate capital markets.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants must be registered and enrolled in a UC Berkeley graduate degree program during the academic year, with priority granted to students in the College of Environmental Design (Architecture, Department of City and Regional Planning-DCRP, Landscape Architecture and Environmental Planning-LAEP), the Haas School of Business, or Berkeley Law. All applicants in good academic standing (e.g., GPA of 3.0 or better, or P or better in Law School classes) are eligible to apply.

APPLICATION PROCESS

The [IGCRE Application for Admission](#) must be submitted to **assigned staff** in their home unit (CED, Haas, Berkeley Law) no later than **OCTOBER 1 (FALL ADMISSION) OR MARCH 1 (SPRING ADMISSION)**. Students who fail to submit an application by the deadline will be **INELIGIBLE** for priority enrollment for the following semester.

PRIORITY ENROLLMENT

Students will receive an email to submit priority enrollment course preferences one semester in advance. Failure to submit course preferences by the stated deadline will result in **DISQUALIFICATION** for priority enrollment. Students will be notified of priority enrollment allocations and instructions for enrollment via email.

Note:

- Priority enrollment is not guaranteed
- Students are not allowed to select priority enrollment for courses in their home unit
- Priority enrollment will be prioritized to students in their final year of graduate study
- If the number of course requests for any one course exceeds the allotted slots available (6), a random sorted lottery will go into effect and only those 6 students selected will get priority enrollment in the high demand class. All others will need to attempt to enroll with the general pool of graduate students and follow all department procedures.

COMPLETION PROCESS

Students must submit the [IGCRE Completion Form](#) no later THAN **ONE MONTH PRIOR TO THE LAST DAY OF THEIR FINAL SEMESTER**. Completion of the IGCRE will be noted in the MEMORANDUM section of a student's official transcript (not on the diploma).

IGCRE CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS

1) COURSEWORK

In addition to the course requirements for their degree, students must complete the course requirements associated with their home unit. Specific requirements for students in each of the units are provided below.

- **College of Environmental Design (Architecture, City and Regional Planning, and Landscape Architecture and Environmental Planning):** Students must take at least three classes from the CED courses listed below, and two additional approved classes in either Haas or Berkeley Law.
- **Haas School of Business:** Students are required to MBA 280 and MBA 283, plus one approved real estate class at Haas and two additional approved classes in either CED or at Berkeley Law.
- **Berkeley Law:** Students must take Property Law, plus one additional approved real estate class in the Berkeley Law and two additional approved classes in either CED or Haas.

Note:

- Students are required to earn minimum grade of B in all certificate related coursework. For classes in the Law School, students must earn minimum grade of P in all of their certificate related coursework.
- A class that is cross-listed in more than one unit—such as Law 257.4: The Art of the Deal—can count towards the ‘outside of home unit’ course requirement, even if the student signs up for the course within their home unit.
- Students with questions about the eligible coursework or IGCRE program requirements should speak to the IGCRE staff within their home unit.
